✓ A Federal Facilities



Rates and active cases are not available for all facilities. Learn why.




Public Health Crisis

- Incarcerated people particularly vulnerable to COVID-19
 - Inadequate PPE
 - Difficulty social distancing
 - Substandard conditions prior to COVID-19
 - People with concentrated health vulnerabilities

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PrisonPandemic: Collecting & Disseminating Stories

Outreach to prisons via mail, community organizations, prison newsletter ads

 <u>Collect stories</u> via hotline calls, letters and other contributions to PO Box, PrisonPandemic website submissions, and gifted submissions.

• Process stories for website by redacting identifying information, transcribing phone calls and letters, voicing letters, and creating shorter topical segments tagged with relevant themes (e.g., infection, family, etc.)

Centering Voices of Incarcerated People

- Incarcerated voices are traditionally censored
 - Prison authorities Correctional oversight
 - Research accessibility challenges Protected Population
 - Stigma People who commit crimes are all "bad people"
- Difficult to collect, share, and amplify personal stories of people who are incarcerated

Ethical Considerations

- Clearly communicated to contributors how their stories would be made publicly available (Consent form)
- Ensured anonymity (Identifying information redacted)
- Protected archive from legal threats (e.g., subpoenas requesting identifying information, retaliation)

Audience

- Scholars across disciplines
- Media (e.g., journalists, documentary filmmakers)
- Advocates (e.g., attorneys investigating constitutional violations in prison)
- Undergraduate students
- Broader public

PrisonPandemic: What's Next

- Expand story-collecting reach (Federal, ICE, Jails)
- Revise website to increase accessibility and searchability
- Long-term preservation and sustainability (with UCI Libraries)
- Outreach via social media, podcast (with Literary Journalism), pedagogical activities, and play (with English)
- Ethics Advisory Board FI, Families, Program Provider, Newly Released
- Research on COVID-19-related mortality across U.S. (Total Mortality Project)
